goes wrong, we’ve already made a difference.”

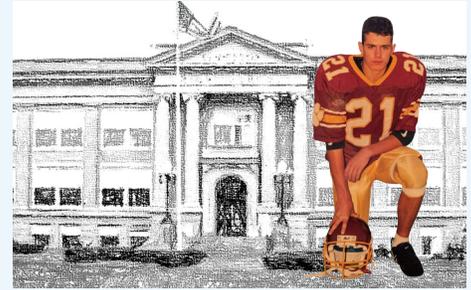
That commitment has empowered thousands to better understand their rights, how insurance companies operate, and when legal guidance is truly needed.
