Wrongful Death Settlement in Sullivan County Workplace Safety Case

New York Injury Law recently secured a **\$3.75 million** settlement in a wrongful death case stemming from serious workplace safety failures at a poultry processing facility in Sullivan County, New York.

The case involved the tragic death of a 36-year-old husband and father who drowned after falling into an unguarded sump pit while responding to recurring flooding at the plant. The facility, originally designed for a different industrial use, had been converted without properly upgrading its drainage systems—creating hazardous conditions.

An investigation revealed multiple safety failures, including an outdated sump system unable to handle poultry waste, a narrow, unprotected pit, slip-

pery grease-covered floors, and a lack of proper training, supervision, and safety protocols. Experts confirmed the incident was entirely preventable and resulted from systemic negligence, not an isolated accident.

The case was brought on behalf of the worker's wife and young daughter. While no settlement can replace their loss, it provides financial support and holds the responsible parties accountable.

This outcome underscores the importance of workplace safety and reinforces that all workers—regardless of background—are entitled to safe conditions. New York Injury Law remains committed to advocating for injured workers and families affected by preventable tragedies.
